Deadline for Entries: Thursday, September 15th

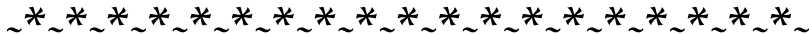

** Winners of Elementary, Middle School and High School Categories will be announced Friday, September 23rd during “Student Day” at the ZOO.

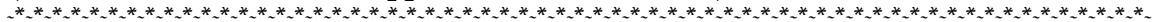
** Winners of the Adult Category will be announced at TSHA’s Board Meeting on Monday September 26th.



- The “Deaf Awareness Week” Poster contest is open to everyone in the Deaf Community. Categories are as follows:
 - Elementary Entrant: grades 1 through 5
 - Middle School Entrant: grades 6th through 8th
 - High School Entrant: grades 9th through 12th
 - Adult Entrant: Age 18 (not enrolled in high school), and up.
- The poster theme must be related to the DAW Theme “Communication Spectrum” Entrant may use these example statements:
 - “Communication is important because...”
 - “Communication means..”
 - “I choose to Communicate by...”Or come up with their own tag line. Poster idea and artwork must be the original concept of the Entrant.
- Posters should not contain likenesses of copyrighted, trademarked, syndicated, or clipart images. Any poster containing such image(s) cannot be entered into the Poster Contest.
- Entries may be done in marker, crayon, watercolor, ink, acrylic, colored pencil, tempura paint, computer generated art or computer generated printing (as long as Rule 2 and 3 are not violated). Entries must be 2D (not 3D).
- On the back of each poster, attach a completed entry form in the upper right corner. Please print legibly in ink or type on the entry form. The entry form may be found below or at www.tsha.cc.
- Entries should be on Poster Board NO LARGER than 28x22 and NO SMALLER THAN 8.5x11. Posters should not be matted, mounted, laminated, framed, folded or rolled.
- Posters must be the work of the Entrant. (Specifically for Students, please note: Parents and Teachers may provide consultation and guidance, but all drawing, lettering and preparation must be the work of the student.)
- Posters submitted for will not be returned.
- Posters will be voted on by the Deaf Community through out the week of September 19th until the 22nd. In the event of a tie, Posters will be judged by the TSHA staff, based upon several elements including artistic talent displayed, overall theme, and relevance to the DAW Theme.
